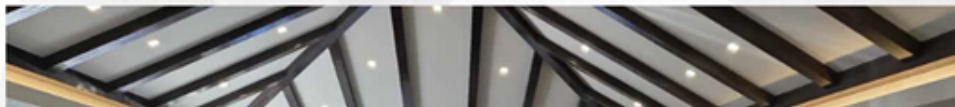
MFC SINGLES

SAY YES!

We were enrolling our son in school. This is his first official year of schooling, and he is turning five years old. As parents, we are excited for this new chapter in his life. While filling out the enrollment form, I came to the section asking for the father's occupation. I typed: "Full-Time Pastoral Missionary, Missionary Families of Christ."

Then I paused. Something stirred in my heart.

I never imagined that one day, the calling God gave me would become part of my son's story as well. It struck me that my vocation is no longer just about me. It has become part of my family's identity. One day, when people ask about his father, my son will say, "My dad is a missionary."

Twelve years ago, I said yes to God's call to become a missionary. I was deeply in love with God, mission, and amazed by the way He transforms lives. My yes was my response to God's love. It is my way of saying, "Lord, I love You too."

Looking back, that yes changed everything. God used the mission to form me into the man I am today. I witnessed lives transformed, families restored, and countless people encounter Christ in a personal way.

Twelve years ago, it was only me saying yes. Today, that yes includes my wife, who

Twelve years ago, it was only me saying yes. Today, that yes includes my wife, who faithfully supports me in the mission. It includes my son, who is growing up seeing what it means to serve God. What began as a personal response to God's invitation has become a family journey.

I realized that every yes to God creates a ripple effect.

We often think our response affects only us. But God uses our yes to bless our families, inspire our friends, strengthen our communities, and touch lives we may never even know. He takes our simple offering and multiplies it for His glory. As missionaries, we are called to make Christ known and loved. Whether through our words, our service, or our witness, we bring the Good News wherever God sends us.

Never underestimate what God can do through your yes. Your yes may inspire your children. Your yes may lead someone back to God. Your yes may become the beginning of a story that will bless generations.

What a privilege it is to be invited into God's mission. What "yes" is God inviting you to give today, and who might be blessed because of your response? If God is calling you, do not be afraid. Say yes.





The MFC Australia Nightly Community Rosary

A sharing from MFC Australia

The MFC Australia Nightly Community Rosary

The MFC Australia nightly rosary was born in a moment when physical gatherings were no longer possible. In August 2020, during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, lockdowns and restrictions made face-to-face evangelisation and prayer meetings effectively impossible across Australia and much of the world. Yet rather than pause, the community turned to technology as a means of continuing its mission of faith.

Through a simple Zoom link invitation at 8:00 PM Sydney time, families were gathered into a shared digital space to pray the rosary each night. What began as a practical response to restriction soon revealed a deeper grace: technology, often seen as distant or impersonal, became a bridge for communion, allowing faith to be shared, strengthened and sustained across homes, states, and even borders.

Growth of a Living Devotion

Over time, the rosary evolved from a small group gathering into a shared responsibility among families, with each household taking turns leading the prayers. This rotation fostered a sense of ownership and communal devotion, where participation was not passive but active and intentional.

Each month, MFC members from a designated Australian state take turns leading the rosary, embracing both the responsibility of guiding the prayer and the privilege of serving the wider community in this shared devotion.

As the practice deepened, a devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus was added before the rosary, setting a more contemplative tone for the evening prayer.



The community also began including prayers to Our Lady of Monte Berico, Saint Roch, and Saint Michael the Archangel, each carrying deep significance for a community shaped by pandemic experience and ongoing pastoral needs.

Saint Roch, long venerated as a protector against plagues and infectious disease, became especially meaningful during and after COVID-19, as families continued to pray for healing, protection, and resilience in the face of illness and uncertainty. His intercession reflects a desire for both physical and spiritual recovery, especially for vulnerable members of the community and their families.

Our Lady of Monte Berico, traditionally invoked as a motherly protector during times of plague and hardship in Vicenza, Italy, also carries strong symbolic meaning. Her presence in the prayer life of the community reflects trust in Mary's maternal care and her role as intercessor during suffering.

"Welcome me, O merciful Mother, under your mantle, which is a maternal mantle."

For many, she represents comfort, protection of families, and hope in moments of fear or transition. Together with Saint Roch, her inclusion reinforces the rosary as a prayer not only of devotion but of refuge and divine assistance in times of distress.

A Prayer Network Across Australia and Beyond

Prayer leaders are guided by a shared visual guide, which also helps the rest of the participants follow along. Remarkably, the rosary has never missed a single day since it began, even when Zoom faltered or when a designated presentation operator was unavailable. In those moments, someone always stepped forward to ensure the prayer continued, reflecting a strong commitment to maintaining the daily rhythm.

Over time, members who live interstate—many of whom have never met in person—became familiar through their roles as online prayer leaders. When gatherings such as MFC Echo conferences take place, there is a sense of recognition and connection, as voices once known only through screens are finally associated with real presence and fellowship.

At the heart of the nightly rosary is a steady stream of personal intentions brought before the Lord. Members pray for healing from illness, safety in travel, resolution of family concerns, and successful visa applications, among many other needs that arise in daily life.

Relatives living outside Australia are also invited to join, extending the reach of the prayer beyond one geographic community. In this way, the rosary becomes more than a devotional practice; it functions as a spiritual support network that responds directly to the real needs of families.

A Foundation for Community Life

The nightly rosary eventually became the foundation upon which other online gatherings were built. Immediately after the prayer, members continue with household meetings, liturgical Bible studies, online teachings, or service meetings among servant leaders. This rhythm has created a natural flow where prayer anchors community life rather than existing alongside it as a separate activity.

Over time, the schedule has become familiar and dependable, with families structuring their evenings around it. The consistency of gathering at the same time each day has fostered a sense of stability, making the rosary an integral part of daily life.

Family Faith and Invitation to Others

One of the most enduring fruits of the nightly rosary is the way it has formed families in prayer. Children learn to recite the prayers and gradually take on leadership roles, while elderly parents remain faithful participants, offering quiet strength and continuity. Along the way, some members who were once part of the online rosary community have passed on and are deeply missed, yet they remain present in memory and prayer, still connected through faith.

An Invitation to Begin the Journey of Prayer

If your family has not yet experienced the beauty of gathering for an intimate time of prayer, consider this an invitation to begin. Organising a simple online rosary—whether through Zoom or another platform—can become a powerful way to bring your household together before God, even across distances and busy schedules.

It does not need to be elaborate or perfect. What matters is the willingness to pause, to pray, and to entrust your home and loved ones to the care of Jesus through the intercession of our Blessed Mother, Mama Mary. In that quiet rhythm of daily prayer, many discover not only peace and unity within the family, but also a deeper personal transformation of heart.

As pilgrims here on earth and missionaries by calling—implied even in the identity we carry—we are reminded that our lives are not lived in isolation but in journey and mission. The Rosary beautifully reflects this reality. Each decade draws us into the story of Jesus and Mary, not as distant figures of history, but as companions in faith who walked the path of obedience, suffering, joy, and glory.

Begin small, remain faithful, and allow the rosary to become a space where grace can enter daily life. You may find, as many have, that what starts as a simple gathering becomes a lasting source of strength, healing, and hope.

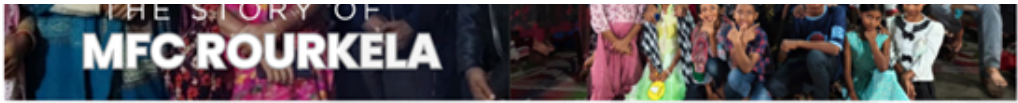

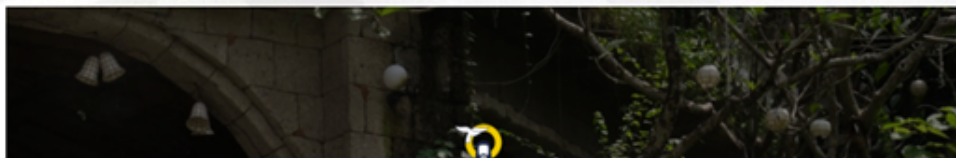
